St. Francis Moto Hope Academy




The Academy started off the new academic year of 2019 in great spirits as we continue to thank God for the great results posted by our graduating class of 2018. We had 37 candidates: who were ranked position 31 out of 997 schools in Nakuru County. All Candidates were admitted to Prestigious National and County High Schools with 100% transition to high schools. This year, the Academy has recorded the highest enrolment of 399 pupils, 244 of whom are boarders. We have 115 new pupils since the beginning of the year.

OF MOTO HOPE VISIT MOTO VILLAGE FOR MEDICAL CAMP

Early this January a team of 15 friends of Moto Hope from Minnesota, Oregon, and Canada travelled for a 12 days mission trip to our Mission Center in Moto village Kenya. For the week they were in the village they examined; our students, the youth and elderly, men and women, from the villages neighboring Moto Hope center. All these benefited from the Minor surgical procedures, dental care/teeth extractions as well as outpatient care. The visiting American medics partnered with our Kenyan medical team on the ground exchanging ideas and knowledge while giving the best care and attention to all patients. A total of 1337 people received medical attention most of whom are poor and lack access to basic health care.













Many thanks to the team for their sacrifice and service offered during the camp. Its beneficiaries continue to appreciate the medical care that has made Moto Hope Center in Kenya a place that offers hope and optimism in life not only to the young ones being educated but also the sick and elderly within the neighborhood. Future medical trips are being planned for the months of September and January every year.

MATERNAL & CHILD HEALTH



Kathy Butler and Fr. Francis have been very instrumental in establishing a relationship that is facilitating a maternal and child health project in the villages neighboring Moto Hope Center. A grant given by Rotary International and Rotary Club of Kelowna, Canada of about \$84,000 managed by Rotary Club of Ruiru, Kenya will enable St. Francis Moto Hope Clinic to improve the pre and post maternal and child health care.

A BIOGAS PLANT

A biogas digester was installed to produce methane gas from the large amounts of biodegradable waste materials from the center as way of recycling waste and promoting clean energy. The gas produced is enough for cooking and heating water used by the students and staff.
