
Molo Medical and Dental Missions Trips

The micro-lending program has boosted her business with loans amounting to **\$800** as a line of credit. The funding has not only kept the single mother in business enabling her to support her family, but also empowered other women and youth, with skills and job opportunities.

Additionally, our program has been offering business consultancy and training services. These have positively transformed the way Percilla and other entrepreneurs do business. Percilla now keeps an up-to-date customer database which assists her to reach out to them whenever she has replenished.

Class of 2021 Excels in Their National Examinations!



The graduating class of 2021 did their standardized national exams early March this year and performed exemplarily well. All our 57 graduate students in 8th grade scored above average with a mean score of 355.39 out of 500 marks in all subjects. This is a positive deviation of 14.08 from the previous graduating class of 2020 that had a mean score of 341.31. The national average of this examination class of 2021 that had over 1.2 Million children was 241.0 mean grade.
